ABOUT THE FOUNDATION

Fifteen years of practical service

Keep Up The Hope (KUTH) Foundation is a Nigerian non-governmental organisation founded on 16 December 2011 by Engr. Gerald A. Azonobo. The Foundation is registered with the Corporate Affairs Commission (No. 48350) and certified by SCUML (RN SC251400170). It responds to verified educational, medical, welfare, legal-aid and community-support needs, allocating resources according to urgency, available funds and its charitable purposes.

KUTH has delivered documented activities in Lagos and Edo State while responding to and reviewing assistance requests from across Nigeria and beyond. Its ten standing programmes are delivered by a volunteer-led team supported by qualified clinical and legal professionals.

THE TEN STANDING PROGRAMMES

● Widows Empowerment Initiative

Food, financial support, micro-grants, skills training and cooperative formation.

● Education & Scholarship Fund

Scholarships from primary to tertiary, supplies, fees, infrastructure and teacher training.

● Free Medical Care & Sponsorship

Surgical sponsorship, mobility aids, free screenings and clearing bills for detained patients.

● Legal Aid for Prison Inmates

Pro bono representation, bail assistance and reintegration. Led by A.R. Omuvwie, Esq.

● Youth Empowerment Programs

Mentoring, vocational training, entrepreneurship, leadership, digital skills and sport.

● Elder Care & Home Support

Facility upgrades, medical support, companionship and geriatric staff training.

● Orphanage Care & Support

Nutrition, educational sponsorship, caregiver training and family reunification.

● Down Syndrome Support

Early intervention, special education, parent networks and awareness campaigns.

● Micro-Schemes (est. 2015)

Village Savings and Loan Associations, asset transfers and a graduation pathway.

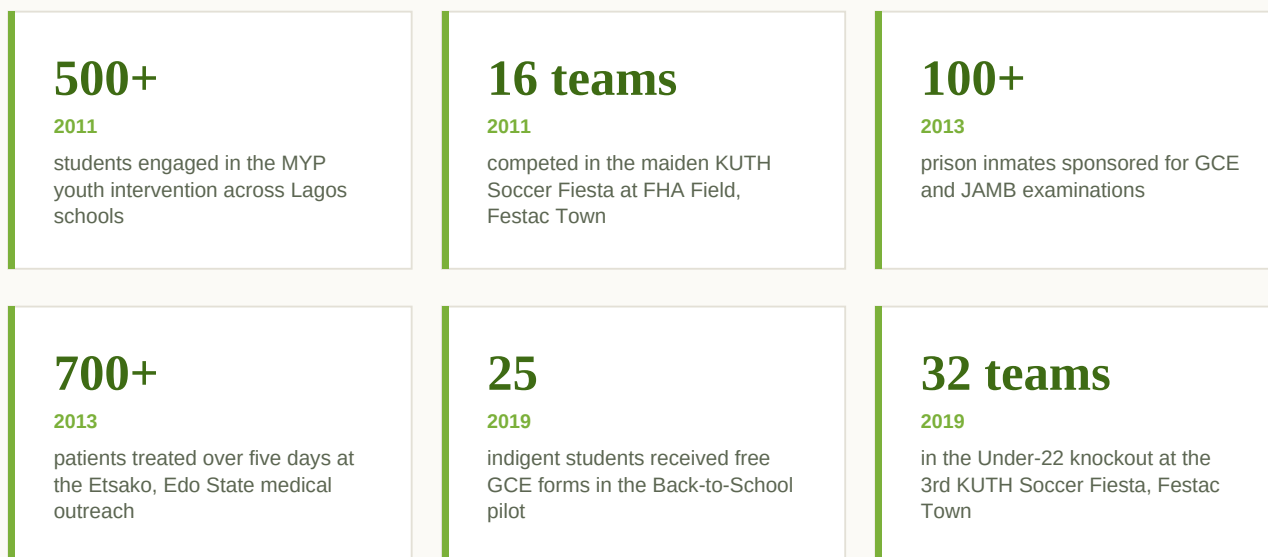
● AVSV & AVAHA
