HOW TO READ THIS DOSSIER

Every figure here is one dated event

Keep Up The Hope Foundation does not publish estimated reach, projected beneficiaries or cumulative figures assembled from assumptions. Each number in this dossier can be traced back to a single programme, held on a stated date, at a named location, with photographs and a published record on the Foundation's website.

Where a programme ran repeatedly, the years are listed separately rather than summed. Where the Foundation holds no count, no number is claimed. This is a deliberately conservative record: the real reach of fifteen years of work is larger than what can be evidenced here.

Dated

Every claim carries the year the programme was held.

Located

Every programme names the venue, community or institution.

Photographed

Archival photography accompanies the published event record.

Unaggregated

Repeat programmes are listed by year, never combined into one headline figure.

THE RECORD

Fifteen years, year by year

- 2011** ● Foundation established, 16 December. CAC Registration No. 48350. MYP: Maximizing Your Potentials launched across Lagos schools, engaging 500+ students. Maiden Soccer Fiesta, 16 teams, FHA Field, Festac Town.
- 2012** ● Official public launch at the Civic Centre, Victoria Island, Lagos. Soccer Fiesta Season 2. First prison outreach, orphanage visitation and medical outreach programmes.
- 2013** ● First outreach beyond Lagos — five-day medical outreach at Irekpa, Etsako West LGA, Edo State, treating 700+ patients. Back-to-School for prison inmates: 100+ sponsored for GCE and JAMB.
- 2014** ● Essay Writing Contest across Lagos secondary schools, with scholarships awarded as prizes.
- 2015** ● Legal Aid for Prison Inmates formalised under A.R. Omuvwie, Esq. KUTH Micro-Scheme established, introducing Village Savings and Loan Associations and a graduation pathway.
- 2018** ● Back-to-School GCE Project delivered at Frankkids Park, Festac, Lagos.
- 2019** ● Makoko waterfront community outreach. Annual visit to Modupe Cole Memorial Child Care Centre. Soccer Fiesta Season 3, 32 teams in the Under-22 knockout. Back-to-School pilot issues 25 free GCE forms.
- 2023–2024** ● Children's Day at Modupe Cole. Christmas programme for widows, with food, welfare support and group distribution. Continued outreach, visitation and welfare programmes.
- 2025** ● Organisational repositioning and development of the 2026–2027 programme; no programme activities were undertaken because adequate funding was unavailable.

THE STANDING WORK — PART ONE

Programme by programme

Widows Empowerment Initiative

Food distribution, direct financial support, micro-grants, skills training and cooperative formation. Delivered annually, including the 2023 Christmas widows programme.

Education & Scholarship Fund

Scholarships from primary to tertiary level, learning supplies, school fees, infrastructure support and teacher training. Includes the 2014 Essay Writing Contest and the Back-to-School GCE Projects of 2018 and 2019.

Free Medical Care & Sponsorship

Surgical sponsorship, mobility aids, free community screenings and clearing the bills of patients detained in hospital. The 2013 Etsako outreach in Edo State treated 700+ patients over five days.

Legal Aid for Prison Inmates

Pro bono representation, bail assistance and reintegration support, formalised in 2015 under A.R. Omuvwie, Esq. In 2013 over 100 inmates were sponsored to sit GCE and JAMB examinations.

Youth Empowerment Programs

Mentoring, vocational training, entrepreneurship support, leadership development, digital skills and sport. The KUTH Soccer Fiesta has run three seasons, growing from 16 teams in 2011 to 32 in 2019.

THE STANDING WORK — PART TWO

Programme by programme

Elder Care & Home Support

Facility upgrades, medical support, companionship visits and geriatric staff training at partner homes.

Orphanage Care & Support

Nutrition, educational sponsorship, caregiver training and family reunification work. Includes annual visits to Modupe Cole Memorial Child Care Centre, Akoka, Lagos, most recently documented in 2023.

Down Syndrome Support

Early intervention, special education placement, parent support networks and public awareness campaigns.

Micro-Schemes (established 2015)

Village Savings and Loan Associations, productive asset transfers and a structured graduation pathway out of extreme poverty for participating households.

AVSV & AVAHA

Advocacy against drug abuse, gender-based violence, human trafficking and cultism; community HIV testing and anti-stigma work.
